CT Scan (Computed Tomography Scanning) uses a thin X-ray beam to produce images of the body that are thin slices. These slices provide high resolution images of both bone and soft tisses. Depending on the type of scan your physician has requested, you may be given a thin barium solution to drink and/or an injection of IV contrast or X-ray dye as part of your exam.
